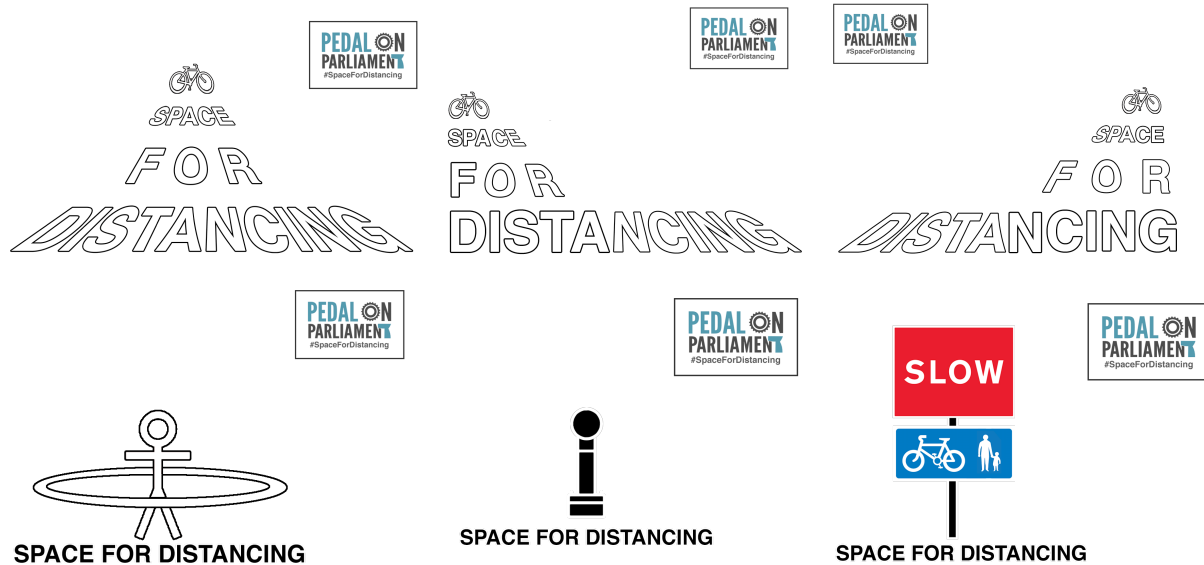


Creating a Space for Distancing image - Windows PC.

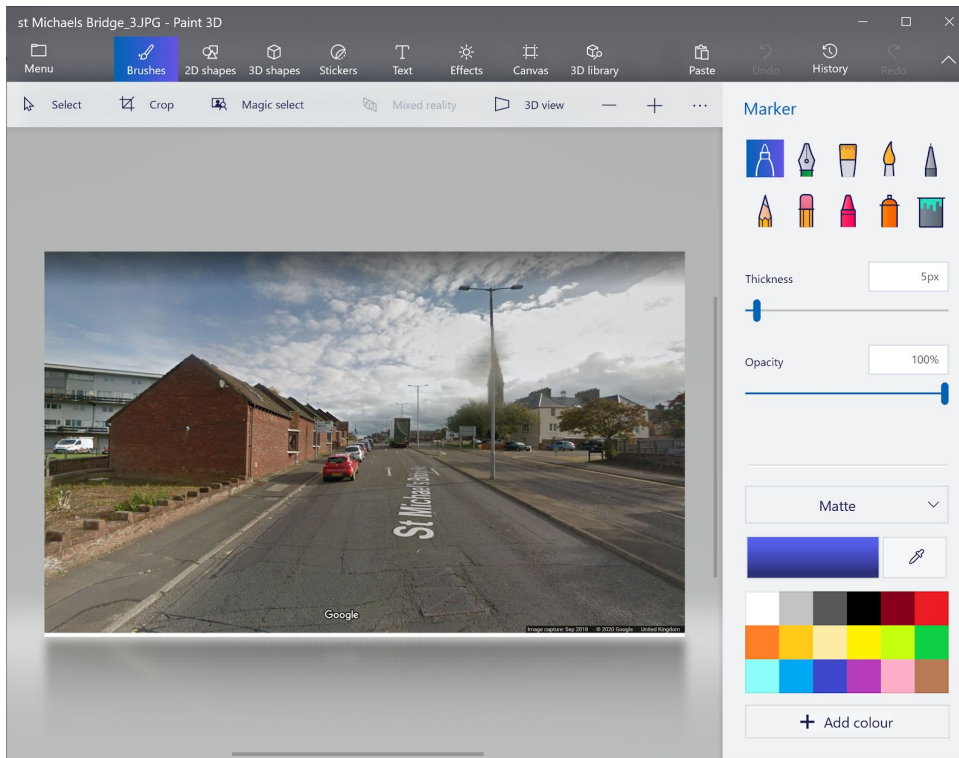


1. Download the Space for Distancing graphics from our web page.
2. Find your street image - it could be a photo you have taken, one someone else has taken (with permission) or one from Google Streetview, which you can capture using the snipping tool or as a screenshot.



The best images to use show the road straight on (please make sure you don't put yourself at risk to get the correct angle though).

3. This example uses Paint 3D (not Paint) which is free and usually comes bundled with Windows 10 but you can use any other image editing software that lets you overlay one image over another.



4. Choose the overlay you want to use from the Space for Distancing bike graphic for a pop-up bike lane, the pedestrian graphic for wider pavements, the bollard graphic for a modal filter (road closure) or the speed graphic for lower speed limits on rural roads.
5. From the menu choose 'Insert' and then open the appropriate file.
6. Resize and move the image around until it looks sensible (note that the bike lane graphic also comes in left hand and right hand versions if you aren't completely straight on to the appropriate lane).
